Pray for the bishops and spouses who will attend, for those organising the event and for the impact it will have on the Anglican Communion in the decade ahead. Saturday 18th: *(Bernard Mizeki, Apostle of the MaShona, Martyr, 1896)*

We remember our friends in Matlosane; giving thanks for the members of the Diocesan Council and asking God's blessing on them as they meet today. Give thanks also for the ministry of recently retired Canon Sam Diphokwane; and pray for those clergy who are unwell: Revd Ephraim Kgotle, Revd Hofney Motsokane and Revd Can Dr Marshall Guma.
